
# Our new Facebook Group for community and fellowship

# FROM the PASTOR

One of the ongoing challenges of life today is how to strengthen our sense of community amidst a pandemic. It is a question faced by families and schools, workplaces and athletic groups. And certainly it is an ongoing theme of our shared life at DPC, too.

With the exception of last month's outdoor service at Central Park, we have not been able to gather in person for worship since March 8 and will not do so until indoor restrictions ease. Even so, your responses as people of faith have not stopped. Prayers and deeds of compassion are still occurring. Learning and planning have taken on creative forms. Acts of generosity and witness continue to inspire. Still, the life of faith is not intended to be experienced alone as we all need ways to strengthen our relationship each another.

Recently, our creative staff met to think about new ways our members can gather even with social distancing and masks. One of the ideas was the launching of a new Facebook group called "DPC Connects" for members and friends of our church. We will have a hymn sing in the churchyard on September 13 and another outdoor service on October 4, too. Details about each of those activities is in this newsletter. Other ideas are in the works, too, focusing on things we can do outside while the weather permits and ways to continue building community as we move into cooler days. Let me tell you about two other opportunities that are starting soon.

Later this month, a group called DPC Dads begins as a way of fostering relationships for fathers of children who range in age from newborn to college. All men blessed with that title know fatherhood is a learn-as-you-go experience that is joyful and

frustrating, fun and hard—sometimes all at the same time! Thus, it is the kind of journey that is best strengthened by gathering with others who are living that experience. The group begins on September 15.

Starting in October, the day's preacher will host an online sermon discussion group on Sunday afternoons. Unlike my seminary preaching classes, the purpose of those gatherings will not be "constructive" feedback on the sermon itself, but focus on such questions as what you heard in that day's message, what it stirred in you, and what connections

it made to your life as a follower of Jesus in 2020. Since sermons are usually one-way, these gatherings are meant to be conversations; to ponder how the Word took on flesh in you that day.

Of course, none of the opportunities outlined above can replace the experience of being together in person for worship and study, service and fellowship, but they can help deepen our sense of community even so. Thus, I encourage you to take advantage of one or more of these new ventures and to pass along your ideas of other gatherings that would be of interest as well.

Even though COVID-19 continues to shape every aspect of life, I am convinced we can emerge from this season stronger and better disciples of Jesus Christ; something that occurs best when we are together. I look forward to sharing in such moments and discoveries with you until and after this pandemic ends.

The program has been extended through September, and probably longer. # FRESH FAITH EXPRESSIONS FOR FALL

In the face of ongoing COVID challenges we in children and youth ministry will be supporting this vital work in different ways and places this fall. Rather than gathering in our building on Sunday morning we are turning to two of God's greatest blessings – the family and the outdoors – as our places for ministry. To mark this new time, our offerings will operate under fresh new names:

1) Seeds of Faith for children in preschool through 4th grade and 2) Thrive! for tweens, youth, and college-age young people.



Seeds of Faith kits are being prepared for families with children in preschool through 4th grade. Families will receive tips for playfully and imaginatively exploring their faith and God's word any time during the week. We are excited to introduce the new Growing in God's Love story Bible to our elementary school children. Each family will receive a preschool and/or elementary school story bible based on the age of their child or children. Kits will be available the week of September 20.



During this COVID time of stony ground and weeds we want to see our tweens, youth and college-age students Thrive! Tired of Zoom and hungry to be together – youth leaders are planning outdoor gatherings for fellowship, faith conversations and face to face interaction which abide by COVID safety guidelines of distancing and the wearing of masks. From these conversations study groups and mission projects will emerge. Keep watch for more details in the coming weeks.

# **DPC UPGRADES**

While the campus has been closed, the property committee has taken advantage of the quieter times to get some projects completed.

Many of these projects go unnoticed, so we'd like to highlight a few of them here.

- First Floor Women's Bathroom in Sanctuary a floor joist was beginning to bend and crack so it was jacked up and secured
- DPC Office added a full wall to one of the cubicles to allow for some sound deflection and privacy.
- Quarterly Preventative Maintenance during our summer maintenance, we upgraded the filters with MERV 11 filters, which provide additional protection from viruses and germs.
- New Electric Hot Water Heater replaced the water heater in the Sanctuary building.
- Lightening Project in Sanctuary rented a lift to replace burnt out bulbs for the chancel area and to replace the others. The new bulbs should last for years to come! 22 large fixtures and 4 smaller fixtures were fitted with

replacement LED bulbs. The lights will be much cooler and the participants will really shine beneath their glow.

Your continued faithfulness has allowed us to complete these projects (safely) as we wait to gather together again (inperson).
