Today's Prayer of Confession is taken from *Call* to Worship: Liturgy, Music, Preaching and the Arts vol. 46.1, p. 53. The Affirmation of Faith is an excerpt from the "Confession of 1967" which, at the time, was the first new creedal statement adopted by the Presbyterian Church in more than three centuries. It proclaims that the life, death, resurrection, and promised coming of Jesus Christ to be the pattern for the church's mission, calling on all Christians to be reconciled to God and to one another.
