Volunteer Job Title: Club 456 Volunteer

Reports To: Becca Bateman, Associate Pastor for Education and Family Ministries

Time Commitment:

- Club 456 meets on Wednesday evenings from 5:30-7:15pm, during the program year (September through May). Volunteers should be present by 5:15pm and remain on-site until all participants have departed for the evening (approximately 7:30pm).
- Volunteers may be asked to help chaperone additional events serving the DPC tween population, such as outings and special events.
- Club 456 volunteers are asked to make a minimum of one-year commitment, though a longer commitment is encouraged.

Purpose: The purpose of this role is to nurture meaningful relationships with Christ and one another, while cultivating a lifelong exploration of faith and servant leadership, within a welcoming and supportive community of adult volunteers and tweens grades four through six.

Duties: Club 456 volunteers may fulfill any number of duties, as determined by the Associate Pastor for Education and Family Ministries. Some of these may include:

- Supervising a shared meal and helping to facilitate discussions and connections
- Helping to implement *MINistry* lessons and facilitating group discussions
- Assisting with mission projects
- Helping to organize activities, games, crafts, and special projects

Requirements and Training:

- All Club 456 volunteers must go through Doylestown Presbyterian Church's Community Protection Program (CPP) certification process, including an application, background checks, and a 30 to 45 minute training.
- We seek warm, supportive volunteers with an understanding of the unique developmental and spiritual needs of tweens.
- Youth volunteers are welcome, provided they have been CPP certified.
