To the contrary, I think people are ready to use their imagination for what God is calling this community to next!

Becca: And that leads us to LOVE.

Mac: When you think of DPC, Becca, what comes to mind about love?

Becca: I think of the encouragement in 1 John 4:7, "Beloved let us love one another, because love is from God," and DPC's courage to deepen our love for one another.

Mac: Verse 8 says, "God is love." We are called to ground ourselves in the God who created love.

Becca: There are so many people at DPC who embody love in word and deed.

Mac: Agreed. That is my early experience here. As we move forward, let's pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love!

ADULT EDUCATION — Bob Maxwell, Moderator

Our mission is to intentionally foster discipleship, fellowship, and nourishment of adult Christian learning communities as we seek to Be a bridge for Christ and a beacon of His love. To do this, we provide a wide range of learning activities to engage members and prospective members in ongoing adult education classes, special presentations, growth groups, and other faith-building activities that span learning styles, educational formats, and curricular needs.

- Continued its sponsorship of Sunday morning classes, including Good News and Other News (a look at current events and issues through a Christian lens), and The Word Among Us.
- Sponsored vibrant and diverse Growth Groups, including these special offerings which met during the spring: Tuesday Night Group,

Wednesday Afternoon Lunch Group; and iLight.

 Arranged for Dr. Peter Enns to join us for both worship and conversation on Sunday, September 14. Dr. Enns is a renowned biblical scholar, author and co-host of The Bible for Normal People podcast.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY — Lindsay Shull, Moderator

The vision of the Children's Ministry Subcommittee is to undertake activities that will help make Christ known to the next generation by sharing with them the scriptures of the Old and New Testaments and their messages of God's love for all His children.

- Sunday School took place each Sunday morning between services for infants in the Nursery through children in 6th grade.
 This year we hired 4 nursery staff to rotate each Sunday and they have been a wonderful addition in helping us serve and care for children and young families on Sunday mornings.
- Children's Worship Time and Children's Worship Time+ was offered for 4 year olds-6th graders during the 10:30 am service each Sunday.

This was the first time an afternoon session of ActingUp was offered as well for the older elementary children to stay through the afternoon and it was a wonderful success!

YOUTH MINISTRY - Kristen

In a welcoming and supportive community, the DPC Youth Ministry team strives to nurture meaningful relationships with Christ and one another, while cultivating a lifelong exploration of faith and servant leadership.



- Youth assisted as VBS leaders, at the community meal, with Code Blue, with Bucks County Housing Group Easter basket shopping, collected food for the food pantry, and assisted in the nursery, as worship leaders, and on the soundboard.
- Two youths served on the Session as Youth Elders and two youths served as Youth Deacons on the Board of Deacons.
- In July, a group of 8 youth and 3 leaders participated in a summer mission trip to Massanetta Springs in Harrisonburg, VA. The group worked at a combined daycare facility for preschool-aged children and adults with special needs, learned about environment-sustaining farming, sorted items in a thrift shop, and volunteered on distribution day at a local food pantry. They bonded over group discussions, games, and refreshing toe-dipping in the natural springs on the property.
- A group of 6 youth -- along with seminarian Jamie Neal and Pastor Becca -- attended a fall retreat at Camp Johnsonburg.
- The Youth Committee ran a successful hoagie fundraiser to support Youth mission efforts, trips, and activities.
- A confirmation class of 7 met from October through April, were celebrated by Session at a brunch, and welcomed as church members on Youth Sunday.
- The program year concluded with Youth Sunday as youth led worship services, and the Youth Choir and Festival Ringers contributed musical talent. High school and college graduates were also honored.

FINANCE — Dave Sager, Moderator

The Finance Subcommittee's mission is to provide comprehensive financial management and oversight, monitoring all aspects of DPC's fiscal operations.

- The operating budget for 2024 ended successfully within budget thanks to the generosity of a faithful congregation providing revenue and the diligence of a dedicated staff to manage expenses. DPC is well on its way to a successful 2025 as we approach the halfway point in the year.
- DPC continues to dedicate 10% of eligible revenue to go towards mission partners and projects.
- Recommended to Session that we used some bequest funds received in early 2025, to pay off our two internal loans from the Endowment Funds. DPC is now debt free.
- Continue to monitor and adjust investments for the Memorials, Bequests and Gift Fund, Mission Endowment Fund and the Endowment Fund.
- Lease renewals were recommended to Session for the two tenants that share our facilities, Building Blocks Learning Center and Jazzercise.

PROPERTY — Jay Stough, Moderator

The Property Subcommittee is entrusted with preserving all Doylestown Presbyterian Church properties to ensure that weekly worship and church supported activities operate freely, safely and without interruption. The mission of the property committee is three-fold: to be responsive to the daily maintenance requirements of all DPC properties; to develop a comprehensive planning process for anticipated maintenance requirements and long term growth; and to establish fiscally responsible plans that give consideration to facilities and equipment with appropriate projects and timing.

- Assisted with community outreach and all-church events, including Advent All Together, Day of Service at DPC on Martin Luther King Day, Fat Sunday, Memorial Day Street Picnic, Pridefest, and Juneteenth, with a focus on facilitating connections within the church and with community members.
- Conducted an accessibility review of our DPC campus.
- Updated the DPC website to be more inviting to those with accessibility concerns and questions.
- Expanded signage in DPC elevators to help with wayfinding, particularly for visitors and new members.
- New this year was the addition of an Outreach component of Connections. The Connections & Outreach Subcommittee and church as a whole will continue to explore more ways in which we can connect and grow in our faith while welcoming our neighbors and wider community to take part in this congregation.

The Hospitality Subcommittee strives to be a reflection of Christ's love as it works to foster internal relationships, welcome visitors, and strengthen our sense of community through Sunday morning coffee hour and beyond.

- Recruited and trained approximately 35 new Hospitality volunteers responsible for hosting and providing treats for coffee hour.
- Developed 9 Hospitality service teams and created a rotating schedule to cover Sacred Grounds and summer Lemonade in the Churchyard.
- Enhanced the coffee hour experience by introducing a selection of special teas, more gluten free options and animal crackers for the children.
- Purchased a new air pot designated for hot water use only.
- Hosted bimonthly new member receptions, providing a special cake for each one.
- Collaborated with other committees and groups for special events such as Day of Service at DPC and Youth Sunday.
- Created Welcome Bags for DPC visitors containing important information about our church, a special DPC mug, and other items.
- Set up a Welcome Table at coffee hour with name tags and welcome bags for visitors.

- Welcomed 21 new members into the first two Inquirers' classes; 17 of whom became members (other 4 scheduled for June class).
- Partnered with the Hospitality Subcommittee to hold a cake reception following the membership service.
- Partnered with elders to become new member sponsors.
- Submitted a policy proposal to Session regarding the membership procedure for previous members who would like to re-join.

We prayerfully join with other DPC committees to work toward equipping our congregation as disciples of Jesus Christ to recognize and understand structures and moments of racism encountered in the places we live, work, learn, worship, and play. We strive to respond as Christ-like allies to collaboratively challenge structural racism and its intersectionality with poverty.

- Shared presentation to the Confirmation Class on what it means to be a Matthew 25 Congregation.
- Co-sponsored with Adult Education Rev. Dr. Eric Barreto *Living Faithfully in Community* Sermon and discussion program.

2024-2025

- Co- Sponsored with Celebrate the Arts and Americans for Native Americans the Martha Redbone Concert.
- Provided an education program and discussion on the Doctrine of Discovery.
- Sponsored discussion lead by Rev. Pauline Sexton on How to Have Difficult Conversations.
- Led a Martin Luther King Day Wreath Laying Service.
- Jointly sponsored with Second Baptist Church of Doylestown
 a Lunch and Learn fundraiser providing opportunities for both
 congregations to strengthen interpersonal relationships. The event
 hosted over 150 people and raised over \$4,000 for the African
 American Museum of Bucks County.
- Co-hosted small bi-weekly groups throughout the year from DPC and Second Baptist to develop relationships and discuss racerelated issues.
- Will be a sponsor of the 4th annual Juneteenth Festival at Mercer Museum in Doylestown Celebrating 150 Anniversary of Freedom from Slavery.

MISSION AND JUSTICE

MISSION — Amy Edenson, Moderator

Seeking to be the hands and feet of Christ, DPC's Mission Subcommittee is called, in partnership with our congregation, to support mission locally, nationally, and globally. The subcommittee focuses on issues of self-development and basic human needs involving food, water, shelter, education, and safety. This support has many facets, including providing opportunities for DPC members to engage in volunteer activities both within and outside our walls and distributing funds to organizations through DPC's various funding sources.

- Advent Mission Market provided alternative giving items during the Advent season that support various missions of individual organizations. Some of these missions include providing fair trade products, employing individuals with special needs, employing individuals who are of lower social economic status and have difficulties finding employment due to lack of job skills, and helping refugee women find employment and gain skills.

- Red Cross Blood Drives held in August and December.
- Caring For Friends monthly meal packing in Andrews Hall kitchen for homebound individuals.
- Code Blue Shelter provided shelter, meals, and showers in Fellowship Hall for 30 homeless guests during February.
- Community Meal held monthly for congregation, community, and homeless guests.
- Feed My Starving Children church-wide meal packing event for malnourished children around the world.

2024-2025

- Food Drive held monthly for the Bucks Country Housing Group food pantry.
- Giving Tree congregation-wide Christmas gifts collection for clients of four of our community mission partners.
- Carversville Farm Foundation volunteer to harvest fresh produce during food gleaning gatherings in the spring and fall.
- Day of Service at DPC in partnership with Connections, created crafts for given to children and women in our mission partner organizations, specifically Hunting Park Christian Academy and Welcoming the Stranger.
- Two Work Trips to the Community Pantry in Gallup, New Mexico.
- Partnered with Children and Youth Ministries to provide mission opportunities through the year.
- Second Annual Community Wide Food Collection Organized volunteers to distribute bags and pick up food donations in Doylestown Borough to be taken to the Doylestown Food Pantry.

PEACE & JUSTICE — Mark Vandersall, Moderator

The Peace and Justice Subcommittee responds to God's call to be peacemakers by supporting the work of our congregation to seek racial and environmental justice, end hunger and poverty, prevent violence, and promote peace.

- Initiated contact with local churches and other organizations dealing with immigration justice issues such as Immigrant Rights Action (ImRA). Participated in monthly roundtable meetings/ discussion organized by ImRA.
- Participated in PC(USA) and Presbytery programming related to immigration.
- Proposed motions to Session to adopt the PC(USA) statement on immigration and to consider what it would mean for DPC to become a Sanctuary Church. This led to Session forming an Ad Hoc committee to study and provide recommendations to Session.

- Working to explore ways DPC can support immigrants and immigration justice.
- Collaborating with Matthew 25 and Adult Ed to develop educational programming for DPC on immigration issues.
- Began work to develop a "Welcome Statement" for DPC, in collaboration with the Connections Subcommittee.
- Led DPC's participation at the Doylestown Pride Festival with other local congregations.

This Interest Group aims to meet the challenge of Global Climate Change while recognizing that effective and timely action is essential. This is the third year that DPC has earned the PC USA designation of an Earth Care Congregation. This assessment looks at the life of the church through its pledge in the

following areas: Worship, Education, Facilities and Outreach.

- Completed the three-part educational series *Stewarding God's Creation* with interactive displays and giveaways.
- Organized a members' Hybrid/EV car show.
- Shared the Carbon Footprint Challenge with individual "bingo" cards that you can check off in the areas you have made a difference in reducing our carbon footprint.
- SWAPS listing and display of things you can use to replace single use items.
- Showing of *Single Use Planet* at Doylestown Borough Hall, cosponsored by the Bucks County Foodshed Alliance.
- Got Sneakers? collection of used sneakers to prevent them going to the landfill.
- Earth Care Sunday through the lens of John Muir on May 25.

- Members of Personnel revised the annual evaluation forms for DPC pastoral and office staff.
- In collaboration with staff and with the approval of Session, Personnel filled open nursery worker positions, choir section leaders, and a leader for the Youth Ministry.

 As DPC continues to evaluate and implement the session and committee restructuring, members of Community Protection Subcommittee explored the subcommittee's relevance given the state of Pennsylvania's legal and regulatory requirements for volunteers working with children under the age of 18



 Subcommittee members continued to provide CPP training and provide oversight and support to DPC staff as they comply with the policy and document volunteer applications, clearances, and training in accordance with state requirements.

- Committee members prepared communion including each Sunday at 8:30 during Lent.
- The Candelabras were replated and look new. They were originally placed in the Sanctuary in 1960.
- Vocal and Bell Choirs and Ensembles provided rich music to our worship services.
- For the second year in a row, the Chancel Choir offered a special music piece for the Maundy Thursday/Tenebrae service—a music tradition we hope will continue.
- Our Celebrate the Arts Series continued with vibrant programs, including the beloved Festival of Lessons and Carols in December.
- Spring 2025, Celebrate the Arts featured a composer residency with Benedict Sheehan.

The Library Subcommittee's mission is to provide books and other resources that will strengthen the lives of members and deepen their relationship with God.

 Received a very generous donation allowing the Library to make much-needed renovations making the space more welcoming and useable for meetings and fellowship. The Subcommittee worked diligently through the summer to bring this to a reality. Over the summer months of 2024, members



worked together to install a computerized library system, clean out and curate the book collection, order new bookshelves and furniture, paint, install lighting and a coffee bar.

- Implemented the new library software and continue to encourage the congregation to use it.
- Hosted author Mike Sielski and his book Magic in the Air on February 23, using the new larger Library space.
- Joined with Matthew 25 Task Force, Peace and Justice, Earth Care, Growth Groups, and Read & Chat with supporting books.

- Little Free Library, now in its ninth year, continues to be well received.
