Volunteer Job Title: Greeter

Reports To: Sue Haldeman, Moderator of the Worship Volunteer Subcommittee

Time Commitment: Greeters for worship serve about 30 minutes per Sunday, and the number of Sundays served is up to the discretion of the volunteer. In addition to Sunday morning worship, greeters are also needed for Celebrate the Arts events, which occur five to six times per year.

Purpose: When a member or visitor enters the church, a greeter is present to offer words of welcome and to help those to enter feel cared for and comfortable. Greeters serve on the frontlines of DPC's hospitality efforts and play a critical role in setting the tone for a member or visitor's experience.

Duties:

- Greeters are to arrive 20 minutes before their assigned service begins, and remain at their station five to 10 minutes after the start of the service to welcome any latecomers.
- Worship greeters should be dressed appropriately for a traditional church service, and greeters for any service or event should wear their DPC nametags when serving in that role.
- At Sunday worship services and during Celebrate the Arts events, there should be at least one greeter located in the narthex and at least one at the Mechanics Street entrance.
- The primary responsibility of the volunteer is to stand at the door, greeting people with words of welcome. Greeters assist visitors in finding the sanctuary, as well as any other locations they may need, such as elevators, restrooms, the nursery, or exits.

Requirements and Training:

- The role of greeter is open to all.
- Training/instructions are provided.
