Volunteer Job Title: Youth Group Leader

Reports To: Becca Bateman, Associate Pastor for Education and Family Ministries

Time Commitment:

- Youth group (grades 6-12) meets on select Sunday evenings (dinner included) from September through May. Volunteers should be at least 15 minutes prior to the start and remain on-site until all participants have departed for the evening.
- In addition to being present at youth group meetings, leaders may be asked to chaperone other events serving the youth population, such as weekend/summer retreats, outings, and special events.
- Youth group leaders are asked to make a minimum of a one-year commitment, though participation for a longer duration is encouraged.

Purpose: The purpose of this role is to nurture meaningful relationships with Christ and one another, while cultivating a lifelong exploration of faith and servant leadership, within a welcoming and supportive community of adults and youth.

Duties: Youth group leaders may fulfill a number of duties, which may include such things as: greeting youth and their parents upon arrival; checking in participants and taking payments for dinner; helping kids feel comfortable and connected to the group; leading games; setting up and using any needed technology; and coordinating meals.

Requirements and Training:

- All youth group leaders must go through Doylestown Presbyterian Church's Community Protection Program (CPP) certification process, including an application, background checks, and a brief training. CPP certification is valid for five years.
- We seek warm, supportive individuals with an understanding of the developmental and spiritual needs of adolescents.
