#### A true story told by Becca from the 2024 Fall Retreat...

At first, it looked like we had three different groups of friends, girls who didn't always mix much back at church. Seven of them, 8th through 10th grade, each quietly wondering if they'd fit in or if they'd end up on the outside of the circle.

But something happened that weekend. Out on the ropes course at Johnsonburg Retreat Center, they couldn't succeed unless they trusted each other. Balancing on wires, holding each other's arms, giving encouragement when someone wanted to give up, suddenly the cliques didn't matter. They cheered for one another, not just their "usual" friends.

In the evenings, they huddled up together, laughing, sharing snacks (So many snacks), and even asking deeper questions about faith. Some of the girls who couldn't come on the trip were still included too, sent texts and messages that said, "we miss you, you're still part of us." And you know what? They felt it. They said later that they did feel welcome, even though they weren't physically there.

It wasn't perfect, but it was a start. The walls began to fall. I hope those girls remember that weekend when friendship felt bigger than a clique. I hope they'll keep trusting that developing relationships with each other here at church is worth it. Because when God opens a door to connection, we never quite go back to the way things were before.

I know church members have been wondering why we switched our confirmation format this year. Let me tell you about the great conversations

- students have been sharing about how they want to prioritize creating
- friendships at church and also that their time is more meaningful if they are
  - able to work on a project or their faith formation for a more significant period of time together. In conversation with families, we will have fewer times we meet but longer times to meet. This is an opportunity for youth in Grade 8 and up to grow in faith and learn about Christian life from historical contemporaries. Youth will also grow their friendships with others their age. Confirmation is the process of becoming a member of the church.
