"The 1700th Birthday of the Nicene Creed - Part 3"

*Affirmation of Faith Sung Response:

The Nicene Creed



We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. (Sung Response.)

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. (Sung Response.)

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen. (Sung Response.)

The Nicene Creed

In the first three centuries, the church found itself in a hostile environment. It was threatened not only by persecution, but also by ideas that were in conflict with the biblical witness. In C.E. 312, Constantine won control of the Roman Empire. Attributing his victory to the intervention of Jesus Christ, he elevated Christianity to favored status in the empire. "One God, one Lord, one faith, one church, one empire, one emperor" became his motto.

Some in the church affirmed that the divinity of Christ, the Son, is of the same substance as the divinity of God, the Father. This can be seen in the line "begotten not made, of one being with the Father," which became a crucial difference going forward and the basis of the Trinitarian language we still use today.

Constantine convened a council in Nicaea in C.E. 325 during which a creed was written. In 381, a second council met in Constantinople. It adopted an expanded form of the 325 creed, now known as the Nicene Creed.

The Nicaean Creed is the most ecumenical of creeds. The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) joins with Eastern Orthodox, Roman Catholic, and most Protestant churches in affirming it.
