



#### **Lingering Reminders**

As most of you know I was installed officially as pastor on Sunday, June 29th. The week after, I went back and watched the YouTube recording of the service to be reminded of what the various ministers had to say. For those of you who were not there, the Reverend Dr. Lisa Hebacker and the Reverend Dr. Ruth Faith Santana-Grace reminded us of our calling.

Rev. Hebacker challenged us to think about which character we are in the story of Jesus healing the paralytic (Mark 2:1-12). I urge you to read the story on your own and answer that question:

- Are you the curious observer outside the house, looking through the door or window?
- Are you inside the house at the feet of Jesus?
- Are you the friend lowering a friend before Jesus?
- Are you the paralyzed man needing Jesus healing?

It is always interesting to place yourself into a gospel story, pondering where you are in relation to Christ at this stage of your life.



Rev. Santana-Grace challenged us all to be torchbearers or beacon bearers (tied to our mission statement). She challenged us in several ways:

- Our Presbyterian "order" is always on the edge of the unknown.
- Christ's light will always break through the darkness.
- See beyond what you see with your eyes be curious and courageous in the hard places of life.
- Be resilient God is faithful to us.
- Be compassionate inside and outside our DPC red doors.
- Power comes from vulnerability.
- Dietrich Bonhoeffer said: "In me there is darkness, in we there is light."

I hope a few of these highlights from the Lisa's sermon and Ruth's charge to the congregation guide us in our shared ministry going forward!

#### **Nominations for Ruling Elders and Deacons**


The Nominating Committee will soon consider candidates to elected in early February and to begin their service in June of 2026.


We'll gather on the bridge following both the 8:30 and 10:30 am services when the schedule resumes on **September 21.**



The PC(USA)'s Special Offering at Pentecost (this year, June 8th) benefits children at risk, youth, and young adults. The 60% that goes to the Presbyterian Mission Agency (PMA) supports denominational efforts like the "Educate a Child, Transform the World" initiative, the Presbyterian Youth Triennium, and the Young Adult Volunteer program (which has both a U.S. and an international focus); the 40% that is designated by DPC this year went to the Friends of the Pakistan Education Board (PEB) for scholarships (visit <a href="www.friendsofpeb.org">www.friendsofpeb.org</a> for more information). PEB estimates that educational costs are \$400 per year for a day student and \$800 for a boarding student. So far, DPC has collected a total of \$1,190, representing \$714 for PMA and \$476 for PEB scholarships, so we have funded one day student!




Back in March, Girl Scout Troop 2372


Here is a snap shot of the financials as of June 30, 2025:
