### Mac's Meanderings A Rhythm Not Yet Heard

In the coming days we will put a poetic invitation on a banner at the front of the church. It's invitation will say, "Come Find a Rhythm Not Yet Heard." This line comes from a poem by John O'Donohue called *For the Artist at the Start of Day*.

One of the jobs of a faith community is to help people find their spiritual rhythm. There are many forces in life that pull us away from spiritual health. Some of these forces are of our own creation and some are not. The spiritual rituals and rhythms of a church helps us better deal with the stress of life.

I often say in new members class, "If you are in town commit to coming to worship." I don't say this because I want a big crowd or a "successful church." I say it because I believe the weekly rhythm of worshipping something bigger than ourselves is a practice that gets us focused on the right thing: Listening for and acknowledging God in our life.

In the rhythm of DPC, you will find the following:

- Humility, grace and mercy,
- · Love of God and neighbor,
- Spiritual grounding,
- Mystery, beauty, and wonder,
- Rights of passage and initiation,
- and intergenerational community.

It's the church leadership's job to offer ritual and rhythm. It's your job to carve out time in your life for those rhythms and rituals to take hold and transform you.

Encourage people you know to come find a spiritual rhythm "not yet heard" this fall. I know God is up to something in your life!


- Linay Richards trained elders in how to read the church financial reports.



To highlight the Season of Peace, **September 7–October 5**, the annual Special Offering is received on World Communion Sunday, this year on **October 5**. Half of your total Peace & Global Witness Offering goes to the national church for peacemaking and global witness work worldwide while 25% goes to presbyteries for similar ministries on the regional level, and 25% is retained by congregations for local peace and reconciliation work. This year our local project is our mission partner, **Welcoming the Stranger**, an educational non-profit that since 1999 has offered free classes in English as a Second Language (ESL), computer skills, and United States citizenship exam preparation to adult immigrants and refugees in the Philadelphia metro region. "I was a stranger and you welcomed me" (Matthew 25:35).
