## Advent 2025 Be Beacon Bearers!

Our theme this Advent is *Be Beacon Bearers*. It ties to the beacon on top of our church building and a charge Rev. Ruth Faith Santana-Grace (Presbytery of Philadelphia Executive Presbyter) gave to the congregation in late June. She said we are called to "bear" Christ's light into the world and that, "Christ's light will always break through the darkness." Advent is a time of anticipation and expectation of the emerging light of Christ.



The lectionary passages we will focus on in worship speak to the coming light of the Triune God. Our Advent devotion will speak to DPC's musicians experience of light through song. New members will light the Advent Wreath candles each week in worship. Each week at 8:30 am, Advent worship we will offer communion by intinction. Music takes more of a central role during Advent and provides hope to rise above our weariness. The theme is also represented in a wonderful piece of original artwork that you'll see in several different places by local artist David Ohlerking.

Rev. Santana-Grace quoted German theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer in her charge to us. He said, "In **me** there is darkness, in **we** there is light." One of the points of this quote is we need each other to find the light and hope of Christ.



## Financial Corner

As we come to the end of the calendar year, we thank you in advance for fulfilling your pledge and prayerfully considering any end of year gifts that will help DPC live into its mission in the community. If you are unsure where you stand with your pledge, you can contact Linay Richards in the office. She can let you know the balance remaining for the current pledge campaign that ends December 31, 2025.

**Deadlines for end of year gifts.** Gifts must be received in the office by 3 pm on Wednesday, **December 31** or be postmarked in the year 2025. You can also make online gifts through our website. Due to processing times, this needs to be done by Friday, **December 26**, to be counted as a contribution in 2025.

Our income (pledges, non-pledge and other income) as of October 31 is slightly under budget (\$7,206) with our-planned budget. Our expenses are under budget by \$114,227 below our planned expense budget.

As a reminder, we had a net income of almost \$265,000 at the end of 2024, to carry us through 2025.

## Setting the Scene for Youth Ministry

## an update from Pastor Becca

I've witnessed quite a few Sunday evenings, our CCR alive (and rowdy) with the sound of chatting while eating dinner, and the hum of some great Christian music. It sounds like a group that feels like family. Around fifteen youth and leaders gather regularly Sunday nights for games and prayer. Even more boosted when we have confirmation class- a class of twelve. All these youth often respond with a resounding YES when asked to lead in various parts of the church, whether it be worship from the front or with the audio-visual crew or teaching a children's class. These simple offers sum up what's been happening across our youth ministry this fall: young people are stepping forward, taking ownership, and finding their voice in faith.





On any given Sunday we might see 25 youth participating in some way. Some come and sit with their families in worship. Two to eight middle schoolers are in Sunday School regularly, two to four youth regularly help with children's programs or in the nursery, modeling servant leadership for the next generation. In the evening add on eight youth are lifting their voices in choir. Four are serving faithfully on Session and Deacon boards. All this momentum follows a summer when three high schoolers and eighteen middle schoolers each gave a week of their lives to mission work. Not to mention fourteen youth and five adults who spent a weekend at Johnsonburg for the fall retreat. The Spirit is moving among our youth, they're not just attending; they're leading, growing, and discovering that faith is something you build together.

This season brings exciting growth within DPC's youth ministry, and as we grow, some shifts naturally follow. We want to share a clear picture of what's happening and where we are headed.

First, we give deep thanks for the faithful leadership and energy our seminarian, Jamie Neal, has brought to our youth. Her presence with the youth has been a gift. As Jamie continues her seminary studies and other ministry commitments, she is not able to offer the expanded hours that our growing youth ministry requires. We are grateful for all she has poured into DPC and will continue to cheer her on as she leans into her call. She has become family to us and we to her, you will still see her on some Sunday mornings. However; now when you spot her, don't limit your questions to youth updates. Ask her how seminary is going, or how much sleep she's getting, or whether she's learned any new fancy theological words this week!

Because the needs of the ministry have outgrown the limited hours this role previously held, DPC will make three key shifts:

- We will conclude our position of seminarian for youth ministry, moving beyond the few weekly hours previously allotted.
- We will begin the search for a full-time permanent Youth Director, someone able to serve our teens and families with dedicated, consistent leadership.
- We will welcome a part-time Interim Youth Director to serve alongside our Youth Leadership Teams during the search process, ensuring strong, steady support for our students.

#### The Peace & Justice Subcommittee

## **Exploration of Pathways to Immigration Justice**

As noted in last month's Tidings, the DPC Peace & Justice Subcommittee will be hosting a series of 4 educational talks by outside speakers on immigration issues in January. We are firming up details, but the first three talks will take place in the **Celtic Cross Room during the education hour** from **9:30-10:15**. The final talk will take place in the afternoon as noted below. These talks will cover four different aspects of the immigration issue, as follows:



**January 4:** Juan Navia from Immigrant Rights Action / The Welcome Project PA will discuss their work on local legal support, advocacy, and accompaniment for immigrants.



**January 11:** William Stock, Esq. from Klasko Immigration Law Partners will review the history of U.S. immigration law and talk about the current legal environment.



**January 18:** Rev. Dr. Samuel Arroyo from Princeton Theological Seminary will discuss the biblical, theological, and moral considerations around immigrants and refugees.



January 25: Professor Zeke Hernandez from the Wharton School / University of Pennsylvania will focus on the economic impact of immigrants on the U.S. This talk will be offered at 4 pm.



## Special Offerings


### **Christmas Joy Offering**
