Mac's Meanderings

Officer Training



In March and April I get the privilege of meeting with the people you elected to be the next class of elders and deacons at Doylestown Presbyterian Church. Our Book of Order says, *“When persons have been elected to the ordered ministry of ruling elder or deacons, the session shall provide a period of study and preparation...”*. This is one of my favorite things to do each year because it is a “deep dive” into:

- What it means to be called by God
- How we function and are governed
- What we believe as Presbyterians

We are using a training resource called *Being Reformed, Faith Seeking Understanding: Ruling Elders/Deacons*. I have used this resource for years in my last church. It has important reminders that I find to be very helpful for all of us to remember. Here are a few examples:

- When someone is called to be an elder or deacon in the Presbyterian Church, it is a three stage process: 1. A sense in the individual that they are called by God to serve in this time and place. 2. The affirmation of the congregation through discernment and vote. 3. A concurring judgement of the Session that these individuals are called. I love how this process has communal accountability built into it. We trust that the Holy Spirit is at work in all three stages.
- Clifton Kirkpatrick writes, *“The purpose of our governance is not to balance political interests in the church, but to enable elected spiritual leaders (ministers and elders) - together in prayer, dialogue, and reflection of God’s Word - to best discern the mind of Christ for the church and the world.”*
- Discernment is central for officers and for all of us. The training resource gives a basic formula for discernment: *“listening prayer, gathering information, listening prayer, holy conversation, listening prayer, reflection/evaluation, and more listening prayer. God is at the center of every spiritual discernment process. Prayer permeates it. Listening prayer is 20 percent talking to God and 80 percent listening to God.”*

Please hold your Session and Deacons in Christ’s loving light as they lead us.

March Session Update



The Session met for their stated meeting on Monday, March 23. The following are highlights from that meeting:

- Shared in small groups how we experience Christ's light.
- Received orientation on the *Realm* Church Database.
- Elders reviewed lists of members who have not been active at DPC for 2 years or longer.
- Approved two baptisms for July 2026.
- Approved a fund-raising hoagie sale for the summer youth trip.
- Approved the Legacy Fund Policy. A policy that supports a financial structure which combines the Memorials, Bequests & Gifts (MBG) Fund, the Endowment Fund, the Mission Endowment Fund, and other designated/undesignated accounts outside of the annual budget. This is intended to enhance awareness, transparency and growth for DPC's financial assets in the coming years.
- Approved an outing organized by the Earth Care Subcommittee to visit a local native plant garden.
- Approved a banner for the church in Pride month (June) using the scripture from John 13:34: *"As I have loved you, you also should love one another."*
- Approved two speakers for a four-week series focused on listening to stories, asking questions, and exploring how we can continue to create a church that reflects Christ's welcome to all people, including members of the LGBTQ+ community.
- Collected feedback on the focus of a future one-day retreat for the session.
- Closed the meeting lifting up prayer requests out of our lives, our relationships, and for the world.

The Session also met two other times in March: Once, electronically, to approve a baptism and in early March to have dinner with 11 Confirmation students, listen to their statements of faith, and welcome them into membership. Thanks be to God!

Church Financial Update: February 2026

1. Budget

- Total Income to Date (YTD): \$330,531.66 (Budget: \$256,080.85)
- Total Expenses to Date (YTD): \$271,927.16 (Budget: \$285,881.35)
- Brief Note: Our income is higher than budgeted due to some pledges paid in full at the beginning of the year.

2. Ministry Impact - one example of your generosity at work

- This month, your generosity supported the Code Blue shelter at DPC (open 21 nights in February, 16-28 guests each night).

Many of you have created an account in **Realm** and we are all starting to learn the ins and outs of the new app.

One lesson learned is that in order for other church members to see your contact information (address, primary phone, and email), the **privacy settings** need to say “Anyone in the Church.” This is the same information that was in the Church Life app that we had previously.

In order to continue to enable members to connect with one another and create an even better community, we will be updating all DPC members, over the age of 18, to have their privacy setting changed to “Anyone in the church” for the home address, primary phone number, and email address. This change will happen on April 15th and if you have an email listed with the church, you will get a Realm Notification regarding this change.

I need an email invitation. What do I do?

Please contact the church office at (215) 348-3531 or dpc@dtownpc.org.

How do I get to Realm on my computer?

You must first respond to the invitation email and activate your profile. After you have activated your profile, go to Realm through the church website or Realm website (www.onrealm.org). Then click on “login” and enter your email address and password.

What if I forgot my password?

You can go to the Realm website (www.onrealm.org), enter your email address and you will be sent an email to reset your password.

Is there a mobile app for smartphones and tablets?

Yes. To use the app, you must first respond to the invitation email and activate your profile. (If you did not receive an email, contact the church office.) To download the iOS or Android app, search for “Realm Connect.” (The full name of the app is “Connect – Our Church Community” from ACS Technologies.)

Can I make changes to my personal and contact information?

Yes! We encourage everyone to update their profiles as needed. To see your personal and contact information, click on the arrow next to your name in the upper right corner of your screen (or “More” in the app). Select “My Profile” to check the information about you. Click on “Edit Profile” to change any of this information.

Should I upload a photo to my profile?

Yes, please! In a church as large as ours, it’s helpful to connect names and faces. Head-shots are best! To upload a photo from your computer, click on the circle containing your initials and follow the prompts.

The Confirmands enjoyed some fellowship on the bridge on March 8 when they became members of DPC following months of learning and service.



This spring, the Adult Education Committee invites the congregation to a four-week series during the education time between services focused on listening to stories, asking questions, and exploring how we continue to create a church that reflects Christ’s welcome, including all people.

This series is hosted by the Growth Group *Bridging the Spectrum*, a group focused on exploring what it means to be a welcoming and inclusive church for members of the LGBTQ+ community, which meets Tuesday evenings by Zoom.

Each week will engage in different dimensions of the story we share:



April 12 - One Family's Story

Walt French shares insights from his work with PFLAG supporting LGBTQ+ families as well as his own family story as a self-described conservative.



April 19 - One Church's Story

Rev. Cassie Heintz shares how Grace Presbyterian Church in Jenkintown has pursued deeper inclusion.



April 26 - One Community's Story

Marlene Pray, founder of Planned Parenthood Keystone's Rainbow Room, will reflect on supporting LGBTQ+ youth in our region.



May 3 - Our Own Story: Today and Tomorrow

Members of DPC will facilitate conversation about the experiences of youth in our own church community. We'll also brainstorm how DPC can continue our efforts to be welcoming and inclusive going forward.


Growing Together in Faith: Growth Groups



Pearl S. Buck Historic Home Tour



Pearl S. Buck was a Nobel and Pulitzer Prize winning author in the early and mid-1900 and her best-known novel is *The Good Earth*, written in 1931. The Pearl S. Buck Homestead in Perkasie is a testament to her unique history, vast literacy achievements and humanitarian causes. The DPC Perennials group is sponsoring a guided tour of the Pearl S. Buck Historic House on **May 7** at 11:00 am to 12:00 pm for DPC Members and friends, with cost of admission is \$15.00 (cash or credit card, paid at the giftshop). There are several gardens on the property and can be visited after the tour.

Since this historic venue is in Perkasie, PA attendees need to provide their own transportation or car pool with others. 


March 15 Youth Group focused on The Fruit of the Spirit. When God’s Spirit is growing in us, it shows up in the way we treat others.

From Another Organ Bench

A note from DPC Organist and Director of Youth Music Rev. Dr. Mina Choi

While Jason Moore (DPC’s Director of Music and the Arts) served on the DPC organ bench the past two Sundays, I had the privilege of playing several organ benches in Sweden—a trip filled with beautiful and meaningful experiences I am still processing.

I led a hymn festival in Jönköping, performed three organ concerts in Jönköping and Stockholm, and facilitated five workshops for pastors, worship leaders, and lay leaders. Together, we explored creative and meaningful ways to engage congregations in worship—on Sundays and beyond. Hosted by Equmeniakyrkan, these gatherings brought together more than 600 people who long to see renewed vitality in worship. Singing together reminded us how deeply it strengthens the body of Christ.

When I was 20, I visited a cathedral in the Netherlands where fewer than 20 people attended worship. That moment moved me deeply and shaped my calling: to help restore vibrant worship where people can encounter the living God. My ministry beyond seminary and DPC focuses on helping churches rediscover God’s presence through song, prayer, and testimony. At the hymn festival, a 60-voice choir sang “Come, Bring Burdens to God” (Glory to God, #851), offering a powerful invitation to lay our burdens before Christ.

Thank you, Jason and DPC, for supporting this calling beyond our church walls. I will continue this work in upcoming trips to Japan and Germany.

I’ve also launched a nonprofit, **Project Illuminae** (“radiant ones”), dedicated to sharing the transformative power of sacred music through artistic excellence, theological depth, and spiritual formation—especially supporting churches with limited resources.
